### From Our Rector We Don't Know Everyone's Entire Story

This morning, I was watching ESPN and catching up on the replays from last night's sporting events. There was a particular story which caught my attention that involved Jorge Lopez, a pitcher for the New York Mets. Upset following a bad inning, he walked off the field and threw his glove into the stands in disgust. When asked about the incident following the game, he stated that he played for ... "the worst team in the entire league!" (I cleaned up the quote for publication!). He also claimed that he was the worst teammate in the league and didn't much care what the reaction of the Mets would be.

I later learned that he was designated for assignment, a fancy terminology in baseball for being fired. I frankly thought it was a reasonable response and wasn't shocked by this decision from management. Sports stations and social media posts alike criticized him relentlessly, and Boomer Esiason, a famous sports figure and now radio host, judge. St. Paul was calling the church in offered harsh criticism for Jorge's behavior. It seemed so obvious that the

player was in the wrong, and that given his behavior and the public nature of his actions and comments, he should have expected the overwhelming public outcry that followed.

By the time I got home, something interesting had changed about the story. People began to learn that Jorge's 11year-old son suffers from a rare chronic illness with lifelong complications. I cannot imagine the struggle he and his family are going through. And knowing this, I felt guilty for my quick judgment of his actions. Boomer Esaison, whose own son Gunnar suffers from cystic fibrosis, offered a heartfelt and sincere public apology for his harsh condemnation of Lopez, because he understands even better than I can the challenges and lifelong obstacles the Lopez family is facing.

It's a long story, with a very important reminder for us. We don't know everyone's whole story. We don't know what challenges others are facing, and we cannot fathom the struggles going on in other people's lives. Perhaps Jesus was reminding me of that and encouraging me to embrace humility and compassion and not be so quick to Colossae to this very way of being when he wrote, "Therefore, as God's chosen

people, holy and dearly loved, clothe *yourselves with compassion, kindness,* humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

We are gracious with others because Jesus is gracious with us. We are called to compassion because Jesus is so compassionate with us. We are called to grace, forgiveness, and love, because Jesus knows us, knows our faults, and yet still chooses to love us so completely.

As disciples of Jesus, let us be gracious, kind, compassionate and patient, because we don't know everyone's whole story, and we might be the very people Jesus calls to love them in their distress. Life is hard. Perhaps by our love, we can bear with each other a bit more and by doing so, lighten the

burden of someone who is struggling.

EYC finished up a wonderful year with our final meeting of the school year on May 5th and our annual beach retreat May 17th-19th. We had an incredible youth group year with lots growth and learning, laughter, spiritual conversations, weekly dinners, and hopefully a new friend or two!

We covered a lot of topics this year but our two main series for the year were: talking about what it means to be a disciple and how we "go and make disciples of all nations" in the fall and "who is Jesus?" in the spring. We also had seasonal activities such as a discussion on saints near All Saints Sunday, Advent and Lent activities, and several weeks celebrating the season of Easter! Our students took our fall theme seriously because by year end, over 50% of our students who attend our weekly meetings were from the community and were invited to EYC by a friend! 

## Weekly Pantry Update

Our drive-thru food distribution with Common Heart continues to go well, as long as we can avoid bad weather on Wednesday evenings! New neighbors continue to learn about our site and we have heard some tough stories about the struggles that people are facing. Here are a few examples:

- Ukranian refugees are having trouble finding work and child care for their children with no "safety net" to fall back on, all while learning a new language and navigating the various agencies that may offer them support.
- We have met many members of the same family that all have homes just down Crane Rd from the church. One of the matriarchs said she has lived in her family home there for 72 years!
- One young couple drove from Cramerton because their power was out for 3 days after the severe storm and tornado that came through the Gastonia area. They had just spent all of the money they had left on groceries and lost everything in their fridge and freezer.
- A man with his wife and baby in the back seat spoke little English, but through a translator app, we learned that he is a construction worker and hadn't been able to work the past 3 days due to the rain making the ground too soft so, he needed food to get by until his schedule got back to normal.
- Several of the people that we have been delivering monthly hot meals to through our CKF ministry have become regulars in our pantry line too. We love seeing their smiling and grateful faces!

#### **Book collection for the Pantry**

St. Margaret's is collecting new and gently used children's books for all ages (infant through high school) to hand out at our weekly Common Heart pantry to families with children. We were able to start distributing these last week and the kids were so excited to
