

From Our Rector

Save some time for Jesus!

Can you believe it is already August? Maybe it's just me, but this summer feels like it has gone by so quickly. I do hope that your summer was filled with joy, connection, rest, and refreshment, and that you and your family are feeling rejuvenated as we all approach the fall season. School begins again, work takes on a more hectic pace, and a myriad of activities and events begin to fill our calendars. As you sit down and prepare yourself for the months ahead, I'd like to make a request of each of you; Save some time for Jesus and save some time for Saint Margaret's.

As I've gotten older (and hopefully wiser along the way) I have learned that I need to be very intentional with my time. With so many things fighting for my time and energy, it is so easy to get to the end of a day, or the end of the week, and realize that I have given Jesus too little of my attention. I get myself

in trouble with my schedule when I fail to sit down with intentionality before the month begins, and schedule my time with Jesus before I do anything else. I would also encourage you to take this opportunity to invite a friend to join you for worship this fall at Saint Margaret's. August 25th will serve as our Red Door Welcome, and we will bless the children, youth, teachers, and their backpacks as they begin a new academic calendar year. This will be a wonderful week to invite someone new to accompany you to church, and I hope that you will take the opportunity to invite a friend or a neighbor to sit with you and hear God's Word and to receive Jesus in the Sacrament.



Reasons to Learn to Sing

William Byrd (ca. 1542-1623) was an English composer who wrote some of the most beautiful and celebrated music for both the Anglican and Roman liturgies.

The following is taken from a 1588 publication of his works:

Reasons briefly set down by the author, to persuade everyone to learn to sing:

- 1. First, it is a knowledge easily taught, and quickly learned, where there is a good master, and an apt scholar.
- 2. The exercise of singing is delightful to Nature, and good to preserve the health of man.
- 3. It doth strengthen all parts of the breast, and doth open the pipes.
- 4. It is a singularly good remedy for stuttering and stammering in the speech.
- 5. It is the best means to procure a perfect pronunciation, and to make a good Orator.
- 6. It is the only way to know where Nature has bestowed the benefit of a good voice: which gift is so rare, as there is not one among a thousand that has it: and, in many that excellent gift is lost, because they want art to express Nature.
- 7. There is not any Music of Instruments whatsoever, comparable to that which is made of the voices of men, where the voices are good, and the same well sorted and ordered.
- 8. The better the voice is, the meeter it is to honour and serve God therewith: and the voice of man is chiefly to be employed to that end. Let every spirit praise the Lord. Since singing is so good a thing, I wish all men would learn to sing.

To learn to better use your voice,

Consider singing in the Adult Choir. Rehearsals will resume on Wednesday, August 14.

The choir rehearses each Wednesday 7:00-8:30pm and warms up on Sundays at 9:30 to sing for the 10:30am Eucharist.



The Children's Choir will resume on September 4, rehearing 4:30-5:45pm on Wednesdays and singing for the 10:30 Eucharist as scheduled.
