From Our Rector Neeply Formed & Neeply Connected

This past Sunday was such a wonderful return to our fall activities at Saint Margaret's. The blessing of the backpacks, students, teachers, and school support staff is always one of my favorite celebrations of the year, and the excitement continued as our youth returned for the EYC kickoff later that same evening. The busy tempo of the fall is upon us, and the faster pace of our community was clear again on Monday morning as I traversed my way through the Union County School traffic (which made me a few minutes late to work) and I was greeted by our preschool staff and their preparation for another great school year. I know it is crazy busy this time of year, but I do have to admit that I love it!

As busy as life can get, I do hope that you will choose to spend some of your time participating in the formation opportunities and Christian fellowship gatherings of our parish. You should have received an email with our Red Door Welcome information, the same packet that was distributed at church this past weekend. The publication details the Sunday formation schedule for the fall,

as well as service opportunities, fellowship gatherings, and a plethora of good information on serving and connecting at our parish. These offerings are so vital to our ongoing relationship with Jesus and each other, and there is something fundamentally different when we come together with fellow disciples and grow deeper in our faith and are more deeply connected to Jesus and one another. From the earliest days the faithful gathered to do just that; to connect with Jesus through His teaching, through worship, and by connecting in the name of Christ with one another. Consider what Luke shares with us in the second chapter of the Acts of the Apostles:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. (Acts 2:42-44)

The early believers knew how important it was to gather, to support one another, to center their individual and collective lives around Jesus and His teachings, and to become connected by being present with each other. Formation by worship was (and is) the central act of faith, but out of that worship stems the need to study more deeply the teachings of our Lord and to gather in joyful community as we bless each other and the community around us. For this fall, we have two adult Sunday School offerings, two weekday Bible studies (with more being planned), and several gatherings for fellowship. We offer teaching for our children and youth, all of which is described in detail in our **Red Door Welcome**, so you can more fully participate in the ongoing life and formation gatherings of our church.

As many of us return to another season of hecticness, I do hope that you will set aside some time for Saint Margaret's, because I believe that time will help deepen your faith and your relationship with Jesus to grow closer.

It is my prayer that our common devotion to our Lord will allow us to be more deeply formed in His image, and more deeply connected to one another.
